Flex Jobs www.flexjobs.com – high-quality remote, hybrid, and flexible jobs that may be worth the cost - 14 day trial \$2.95 – then \$5.95 each month

Wahve <https://wahve.com/retiring-professionals> is an example of a company that helps retiring individuals ease into retirement while working from home. Wahve provides contract staff for long-term assignments to companies across the insurance industry.

Seniors4Hire www.seniors4hire.org is an online community for those 50 – must register to search jobs. It pulls most of its jobs from Zip Recruiter

Retirementjobs.com www.retirementjobs.com provides limited links to jobs by zip code and interest area. There are a few featured jobs but most are pulled from ZipRecruiter or Monster.com

The National Experienced Workforce Solutions www.newsolutions.org dedicated to expanding employment opportunities for those 55+ with federal government agencies. They operate the federally funded Oakland Senior Community Service Employment Program (SCSEP) for qualified low income seniors. It is a work-based job training program (703) 558-4200 or (530) 768-5252. NAPCA Self Help for the Elderly operates a similar program for Richmond residents. Call (415) 677-7500 or (415) 624-9530.

www.linkedin.com – **LinkedIn** to stay in touch with your network and look for jobs. “Learning” section offers access to multiple courses for \$34.99 a month and sometimes offers first month for free. Must create an account with a profile to use the features of the site

Glassdoor www.glassdoor.com has reviews of employers given by former employees. This is a window to learn about a company’s culture which may offer comments on attitudes about aging. Join to participate.

Indeed.com www.indeed.com can be searched by zip code and any interest area. Putting in “remote” pulls up remote and hybrid possibilities – used by all ages – not just seniors.

Craigslist www.craigslist.org is a good source for local jobs for all ages – not just seniors. It can be searched by geographic area such as San Francisco Bay area and by various career areas
